Effectiveness and Impact on the Completion of the Project:

Conducted campaigns to educate voters of their rights and disseminate information about the electoral process across Cambodia. 100 DHRAC disseminator/observer taskforces were consulting with the voting public and providing non-partisan information and observing 1985 polling stations in all 24 provinces-municipalities.

330000 copies of Voters' Guide, attractive Voters' Guides for the 2012 Commune Council Elections encouraging participation and discouraging vote-buying and other election issues, irregularities and procedures. Each tool of the Voters' Guide could at least be read by 5 Cambodian voters.

330000 copies of Voters' Guide made it at least 3 million Cambodian voters in all over the country to receive information of the Commune Council Elections on 3rd mandate, 2012.

Voters were receiving direct information via dissemination Voters' Guide regarding the Commune Council Elections on June 3, 2012.

Population benefited by the Project:

These 330000 copies of Voters' Guide made it at least 3 million Cambodian voters, equivalent to 33% in all over the country to receive information of the Commune Council Elections in 2012.

Each Voters' Guide could at least be read by 5 Cambodian voters. This means that 18% of Cambodian voters read Voters' Guide during electoral campaign.

Effectiveness and Impact:

The Voters' Guide had already proved to be an effective tool for Cambodian voter education in previous elections. Demanded increases with each new election, particularly with the newness of Commune Council



Elections, and so must our dissemination. The right to vote was a constitutional guarantee; DHRAC and AT aim to make this fundamental right more of a reality by ensuring that it was actually exercised by as many citizens as possible in an informed and independent manner. When this happens, the electoral process gains in quality and meaning for it reflect the genuine sentiments and desires of voters.

In the third mandate of the Commune Council Elections on June 3, 2012, the Voters' Guide had probably been received information at least 3 million Cambodian voters in all 24 provinces-municipalities of Cambodia. This means that 33% of voters received DHRAC's and AT's non-partisan information before the voting day.

Each Voters' Guide could at least be read by 5 Cambodian voters, equivalent to 18% in all over the 24 provinces-municipalities to read these voter education tools (Voters' Guide) of the Commune Council Elections on June 2012.

The 10 political parties who participated in the Voters' Guide benefited by becoming known to and informed by voters. Thanks to DHRAC and AT activities, citizens had the opportunity to familiarize themselves with different political parties running for elections, different lines of policy and leaders to vote for. DHRAC and AT organizations offered political parties an opportunity to explain their positions to voters.

Although the project for the printing Voters' Guide was financed by the KUSANONE through Embassy of Japan in the Kingdom of Cambodia, other difficulties arose. Some challenges were keeping up-to-date with NEC's perpetually changing schedule, and occasional complications in obtaining the complete cooperation from political parties. In the end, DHRAC and AT accomplished its mission, because everything went smoothly and on time.

The printing Voters' Guide took 14 days and the transportation 330000 copies of these documents to all 24 provinces-municipalities took 8 days. The operation was successful for DHRAC and AT teams.

The dissemination 3300000 copies of Voters' Guide to all 24 provinces-municipalities with 101 districts-divisions and 481 communes-sections by 100 DHRAC disseminator-observer taskforces took only 5 days. The DHRAC provincial-municipality and district-division coordinators, especially disseminator/observer taskforces successfully accomplished the work in very short time.

The information of Voters' Guide was covered by many English-language and Khmer-language newspapers and televisions. The content of the Voters' Guide was also presented and discussed on several meeting, seminars, workshops, conferences, forums and radio activities.

The information of Voters' Guide was covered by many English-language and Khmer-language by local and international press releases and websites of civil society organizations and presses. The content of the Voters' Guide was also feedback from readers and recipient information from Voters' Guide by phone and e-mail in local and international.

The President of National Election Committee had issued Thank You Letter to DHRAC who had sacrificed time, physical and work to joint to educate and inform the equal election information to all Cambodian voters in all 24 provinces-municipalities for the Commune Council Elections, 3rd mandate, 3rd June 2012.

Maintenance/Follow-up of the Project in the future:

The 24 provincial-municipality networks, especially the 100 disseminator/observer taskforces of DHRAC conducted follow-up project every months after election in order they received comments and feedbacks from voters on the effect and impact Voters' Guide in the grassroots through meeting, seminars, workshops, conferences, forums, especially the fill visit for short term project of local and international organizations.

In order to, the 2 DHRAC staffs, Mr. Kean Ponlork, Deputy Executive Director and Mr. Kan Puth, Head of Elections Unit on August 23-24, November 10-14 and December 12-29, 2012 conducted fill visit and follow-up on the recent past Commune Council Elections in the 11 different provinces-municipalities (Kandal, Phnom Penh, Svay Rieng, Prey Veng, Kampong Cham, Kampong Thom, Siem Reap, Banteay Meanchey, Battambang, Pursat and Kampong Chhnang) in which the Voters' Guide was disseminated during electoral campaign. The voters suggested us to continue to produce to them and more Cambodian voters, especially beside their commune, because its tool was very equal election information for voters.

The DHRAC staffs followed-up the effective tools of Voters' Guide and got comments include feedbacks from grassroots, political party and international, local and ASEAN regional organization networks including NEC, especially working group for electoral reform and election monitoring through ground preparation, meeting and workshop those always presented to effective and impact of human rights and democracy through election problems in Cambodia, especially, reformed members of NEC, election law and election regulation and procedure including voter list review and voter registration in 2012 for the national assembly elections, 5th mandate, 28th July 2013 upcoming, in order to, they had always advocated to create an organic law on political campaign finance law for general election in Cambodia. By the way, DHRAC staffs always suggested strengthening and increase more transparent broadcast and dissemination information to all voters during voter list review and voter registration campaign, especially, during electoral campaign. In order to, DHRAC always received feedbacks and comments from them that DHRAC would be more increased and disseminated to voters in all communes and could be increased a long period for voters to read content of Voters' Guide and can be compared to each political platform and make decision right to vote.

The DHRAC always followed-up through conducted 4 workshops on Political Campaign Finance in different 4 provinces such as Svay Rieng held on December 14, 2012 at Chhne Tonle Hall with more than 200 participants (Cambodian voters, students, CSOs, media, PEC, parliamentarians, commune councils, district and provincial governors from different 8 districts each), Battambang (December 17, 2012 at Khemara Battambang I Hotel), Siem Reap (December 25, 2012 at New Siem Reap Town Hotel & Spa) and Kampong Cham (December 28, 2012 at Phnom Proh Hotel). In order to, all speakers (CSOs, Parliamentarians and Members of Political Party, Presenters and Participants always presented and questioned to election issues such as Political Campaign Finance of the parties, Vote Buying, Using State Resources and Access to Election Information from every media and institutions during electoral campaign.

During the electoral campaign for the CCE in 2012, the Officials of Embassy of Japan, Mr. Mori Nobo, Second Secretary of Embassy of Japan in the Kingdom of Cambodia and Ms. LOW LY Y, KUSANONE Grant Coordinator monitor dissemination Voters' Guide in the 2 different provinces-municipalities such as Kandal province and Phnom Penh city. Post election, the Officials of Embassy of Japan, Ms. LOW LY Y, KUSANONE Grant Coordinator and DHRAC staffs, Mr. Kean Ponlork, Deputy Executive Director, Mr. Kan Puth, Head of Elections Unit, include Ms. Leat Pokun, Siem Reap Provincial Coordinator and Ms. Thuon Hing, Puek District Coordinator visited to evaluate the printing Voters' Guide project for the CCE in 2012 in target areas such as Puek District with 2 different communes (Puek and Khnat). In order to, 5 beneficiaries responded that they received voter education tools (Voters' Guide) during electoral campaign; especially they told that these tools were very easily understood and natural and held them more spirit about election processes. Moreover, they voted to political party by willingness on Election Day. In order to, they suggested to Sponsors, People of Japan and Producers, DHRAC and AT would be printed and disseminated these tools to their communes and others in Cambodia next elections. By the way, Ms. LOW LY Y participated Seminar on Political Campaign Finance at New Siem Reap Town Hotel and shared lesson learns and experiences on democracy, especially election process in Cambodia to participants during group discussion. In order to, DHRAC's Siem Reap Provincial Coordinator, Ms. Leat Pokun distributed 50 questionnaires to participants file in before conduct seminar by themselves. 50 participants came from 5 different districts-municipalities (Puek, Prasat Barkorng, Angkor Chum, Banteay Srey and Siem Reap) with 19 communes-sections (Khnat, Lvear, Mukpen, Portry, Puek, Char Chhouk, Doun Pen, Kork Doung, Kaol, Nokor Peah, Balang, Kantrang, Barkorng, Kandek, Rolues, Thkol, Praah Dak, Kork Chork and Salakamreok). Moreover, 44 participants suggested to donor and organization would be continued to produced and disseminate to their communes and others next elections.

The DHRAC provincial-municipality networks had also short term project with other local and international organizations in the grassroots including participated in workshops, forums and meetings in order they received feedbacks and information from voters; its voter education tools were very equal election information, especially political platforms. Therefore, they recommended and suggested to networks could be disseminated during a half month before election and easily reading and right considering and deciding to vote in order they wanted commune political leaders who could increase their living life and improve local human rights, especially fulfill accountable by their promise in political platform.

Every month after election, the DHRAC staffs strongly effort to engage Voters' Guide project with election issues through as a speech in workshops, seminars and radios including meetings and conferences with national and international organizations, embassies and government institutions, especially working groups of civil society organizations on election reform and National Election Committee in order DHRAC staffs received feedbacks and suggestions from them. They told us they thanked to Embassy of Japan including teams of DHRAC and AT were very great to produce, educate an awareness and equal access to election information to Cambodian voters; especially they got the election information by Voters' Guide for their institutions and their projects for researching. In order to, they suggested us could be increased more Voters' Guide for Cambodian voters and disseminated more sites of Cambodia.

The DHRAC and AT needs increased funding to print more copies of the Voters' Guide and to add more transportations.

In order to be read by more voters, additional copies of the Voters' Guide should be printed. DHRAC and AT wish to increase and improve the disseminator/observer taskforces in all 24 provinces-municipalities.

The DHRAC and AT needs per diem for producers and disseminator taskforces increase and improve disseminator/observer taskforces in all 24 provinces-municipalities and easily disseminate Voters' Guide to Cambodian voters.

The dissemination timetable needs to be longer in order to simplify and facilitate the tasks of DHRAC's disseminators. The Voters' Guide should be in the hands of citizens in the first week of the electoral campaign. In order to avoid working in hastily, DHRAC and AT welcomes timely funding from donors (at least 4 months before the printing Voters' Guide), because there are so many lessons learned from administrative obligations, political parties cooperation and NEC's schedule. To deal with political parties and local administrations, the DHRAC and AT teams needs time, patience and very often petty cash to fulfill numerous protocols. To produce the Voters' Guide, we also need political parties to submit their political program descriptions in advance. These parties required a great deal of time and explanation to cooperate completely with DHRAC and AT. Finally, there were numerous difficulties in follow with the NEC's constantly changing schedule.

The political parties and NEC very often change contents and form of Voters' Guide.
